

# 2010 CTASLA Student Scholarship Form

Connecticut Chapter, American Society of Landscape Architects (CTASLA)

The CTASLA Student Scholarship is provided for students who are pursuing an education in the field of Landscape Architecture. This scholarship is funded by the annual CTASLA Golf Outing event through the generous support of its players and sponsors.

Scholarships are typically in the amount of **\$2,500.00** and are awarded for tuition, books, project supplies, etc. Scholarships may vary from year to year depending on the funds available.

## Scholarship Criteria

1. Applicants must be a **legal resident of the State of Connecticut** and be enrolled in an accredited landscape architecture or environmental education program (undergraduate or graduate) at the college/university level.
2. Through your college/university, you will provide CTASLA with verification of your status as a student. Payment will be made directly to the college/university that you select.
3. All decisions made by the Scholarship Committee\* are deemed final, including the option not to award a scholarship. Relatives of CT-licensed Landscape Architects and CTASLA members are encouraged to apply.

## Procedures / Requirements

To insure your application is reviewed and processed quickly and accurately please follow these procedures.

### The student must:

1. Complete the application personally and completely.
2. Applications must be **postmarked between January 1 and March 15, 2010**. **Scholarships are announced by May 15, 2010**. Mail completed application to: **CTASLA Scholarship Committee, CTASLA Office, 370 James Street, Suite 402, New Haven, CT 06513**.
3. Faxed or emailed applications will not be accepted.
4. Include your name and Social Security number on each page of the application.
5. Attach a transcript of your high school or college grades covering six semesters only. The transcript need not be "official."
6. Provide a brief statement that clearly states why you desire this financial aid, and why you have chosen Landscape Architecture as your field of study. This statement must be signed by the applicant.

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7. Provide one signed recommendation letter from a person who knows you personally and can explain why you would succeed in this course of study. No other recommendation or endorsement is required.
